Writer's Eye 2017 | **visitation guidelines**

Teachers/chaperones

There should be at least one adult for every 15 children. Our volunteers count on your assistance to make the Museum tour a positive experience for all; student discipline is the responsibility of teachers and chaperones. Chaperones should not engage in conversation with one another during tours.

Personal belongings

Students, teachers, and chaperones should leave coats, umbrellas, and all personal belongings in the bins provided for each group, or in the first floor coat room.

School first aid kits

School first aid kits may be brought in a backpack; however, the pack must be carried, not worn on your back.

Touch with your eyes, not with your hands

Touching works of art, and touching or leaning on display cases, pedestals, and walls are prohibited at all times.

Walk & use quiet, conversational voices

Running, fast movements, and yelling in the galleries are prohibited.

Writing or drawing

Visitors who would like to draw or write in the galleries must use pencil only. Extra pencils are available at the reception desk. Painting is not permitted in the galleries.

Food and drink

Food, drinks, and gum are not allowed in the Museum.

Cell phones

Please silence and put away all cell phones. If you must keep the phone on, please put it in vibrate mode.

Cameras

Photography is not permitted inside the Museum
